

Studying the book of Daniel has been very interesting and even confusing at the same time, but I've received many lessons from Daniel's life.

We learned about the visions God gave Daniel. God would show His servant statues, terrifying beasts, and horns to represent all the kingdoms, built out of human greed, in order. Now all of this confused Daniel and it definitely confused me too. But near the end of the book, God tells Daniel to not tell anybody about the visions he saw for those visions were not for his time or his generation. When I read that, I finally understood why God gave Daniel those visions. God wanted to let all of us know that He is in full control.






Freshmen English:
