During our summer break in June 2021, Alissa's family and my family decided to go to Utah for about a week. We spent a lot of time at Zion National Park, and went to see the Spiral Jetty on the Great Salt Lake. For me, the most memorable part of the trip was hiking up Angel's Landing.

Angel's Landing is a rock formation at Zion that you can hike. It's a lot of uphill walking, and in the last half, you have to hold onto chains that were put into the rock so that you don't slip and fall about a thousand feet to the canyon floor below. Alissa didn't want to wake up super early, and my brother is scared of heights, so it was just my uncle and I who went.

I remember waking up at around 4:30 so that we could get to the shuttles by 6 am. We finally started our ascent around 7-7:30 am.

Once we got to the part with the chains, and I saw how high up we were, I said a silent prayer that I wouldn't make a mistake and fall off the cliff right next to me.

Along one of the narrowest parts where there was traffic going both up and down, I almost fell, but caught myself just before anyone even noticed I was going to fall.



I think that in that moment, I felt the most alive I've ever felt, being in God's nature that he created. Being that high up and seeing the valley and the shadows cast by the huge rocks also reminds me of a verse from Psalms 23:4, which says, "Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me".

Throughout my hike, God kept me and my uncle safe so that I wouldn't fall. If you put your faith in God, he will keep you safe and give you all that you need.
